

## COMMUNITY GROUP QUESTIONS FOR EXODUS

- 1) According to Jesus (Mk. 12:26), Moses wrote the book of Exodus. He did this as he looked back at the amazing things God had done in his lifetime and tried to let others know about all that the Lord had done. If you were writing a book about your own life and all that God had done, what details would you include?
- 2) The first 6 chapters of Exodus tell the story of God shaping Moses as a leader. How did the Lord change Moses to prepare him for leadership? If there was one thing the Lord need to change in you to prepare you for this next season in life, what do you think He would choose?
- 3) Why did God choose to use plagues in Egypt to free His people? (see chapters 7-12) What is especially troubling about the Passover and why did God use this event specifically?
- 4) Throughout the Exodus account, the people of Israel keep making monumental mistakes? Why? How does their unfaithfulness mirror the failures in faith you have experienced?
- 5) Chapters 19-34 describe the giving of the Law (one of the most significant events in Jewish history). What is the big message the Lord is communicating to people through the giving of the Law? How does the Law set us up for the work of Jesus? (see Romans 3:19-26)
- 6) Exodus 34:5-14 displays the first time recorded that God verbally described his own character to humanity.... What does this description tell you about His attributes? Are there certain attributes that He emphasizes that you may not emphasize yourself?
- 7) The final portion of Exodus recounts the details concerning the Tabernacle and the Ark of the Covenant. What is the significance of these two symbols? Why do you think God chose to have His people make them?
- 8) Make a list of all the things you can recall that God has delivered you from. Share that list with someone this week.
