## COMMUNITY GROUP QUESTIONS FOR 1 & 2 CORINTHIANS

## **EXPLORATION**

- 1. Ask someone to read 1 Corinthians 3: 10-15

  Our foundation as Christians is Jesus Christ. What do the gold, silver and costly stones represent and what do the wood, hay and straw represent?
- 2. Ask someone to read 1 Corinthians 12:12-27

  Why is it important that every Christian does their part in the body of Christ?

3. Ask someone to read 1 Corinthians 13

Paul here is describing agape love. How would you sum up agape love for someone if you could only share one or two sentences? How can a Christian love in this way?

4.	Ask someone to read 2 Corinthians 4:16-18  How do our light and momentary troubles achieve for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all?
5.	Ask someone to read 2 Corinthians 9:6-8  Christians in the United States offer an average church giving of 2.5% of their net income according to Christianity Today. During the Great Depression, Christians gave 3.3%. How is giving a reflection of our hearts?
